Outline of the Exhibition

This exhibition is the first large-scale solo museum exhibition of artist Tohru Nakazaki, who produces diverse artworks with the theme of gap, using lenient methods. Looking into his recent literary installations based on interviews, the exhibition premieres his latest work that deciphers Mito and Art Tower Mito, along with his past works, including his representative ones, presenting a comprehensive picture of Tohru Nakazaki.

Born in 1976 in Mito, he first encountered Art Tower Mito's activities when he was a high school student, starting his path to becoming an artist. Since then, he has visited our exhibitions as an audience, and after he moved the base of his artistic activities to Mito in 2007, he started to be involved in our activities as an artist. In this exhibition, featuring Mito, Nakazaki's hometown, and Art Tower Mito, the museum most familiar to him, as motifs, he conjures up "another story" about them, captured from a unique perspective, through interviews and research. In addition, the exhibition traces his artistic activities by featuring his old and new works together, from his early works with signboard motifs through his paintings, drawings, and recompositions of past installations to his recent three-dimensional works with acrylic colors and fluorescent lights.

From growing up, through encounter with contemporary art, to the present as a contemporary artist—assuming an air of autobiography, this milestone solo exhibition could be realized only in Nakazaki's hometown.

Ever since I can remember, Mito Komon, the period drama with a protagonist from Mito, was on TV in prime time. I'm a born and bred Mito native, who grew up feeling, even as a kid, somewhat proud to see the name of the town I live in every week on TV. Yet when I was still small, I woke up from the dream of believing my grandpa actually was Mito Komon, and realized Santa Claus didn't exist. Probably it was a bit later that I learned Mito Komon didn't actually travel around Japan as much as he does in the drama.

Yet that doesn't mean I woke up from the story. Just like the period drama on TV was entertainment presupposing an element of fiction, art is also woven by continuously going back and forth between story, fiction, and reality, just like Echigo-no-Chirimen-Donya, the fictional identity Mito Komon famously presents himself with. I assume I have been on a journey, wandering in a gap between reality and fiction for more than 20 years. I probably believe that a lie like a joke can sometimes be an instrumental force in producing reality like a dream.

▼Tohru Nakazaki

Artist. Born in Ibaraki, in 1976. Studied at the Musashino Art University Graduate School of Art and Design, Doctoral Degree in Design. Currently based in Mito. He is a multimedia artist, working with performance, video, and installation, mainly using signboards as motifs. He explores the dissonance that occurs in our commonalities, such as language and images, working across various mediums. In 2006, he formed the artist unit Nadegata Instant Party. In 2007, he founded the space PLAYROOM (NAKAZAKI Tohru + Mizuki Endo). Since 2011, he has been in charge of the artistic direction of "Project FUKUSHIMA!"



▼Highlights of the Exhibition

① The first solo museum exhibition of Tohru Nakazaki, who is from and lives in Mito, where we are located

Growing up in Mito, Nakazaki started to have contact with Art Tower Mito's activities when he was about 18 years old and then started to pursue a career as an artist, which means that since 1994, he has appreciated our exhibitions for more than a quarter of century. Since he moved the base of his artistic activities to Mito in 2007, he has steadily built up a collaborative relationship with Art Tower Mito as both an audience member and an artist. For this occasion, focusing on the method he has been employing recently, we invite him for his first museum solo exhibition. As the solo exhibition is in his hometown, his latest work produced for this exhibition and specifically about Mito is the highlight of the exhibition.

② Presentation of Nakazaki's latest work with the themes of Mito and Art Tower Mito

In recent years, Nakazaki has been producing literary installations about specific sites' history and characteristics by interviewing relevant people and composing a story with a unique perspective, using the extracted words. For this new exhibition, with the motifs of Mito and Art Tower Mito, he conducted interviews with five people who have connections to Mito and Art Tower Mito and researched literature about the founding of Art Tower Mito to conjure up "another story" about them. The interviews include one with his parents by Nakazaki, giving it a sense of autobiography, and making it a milestone work that was possible only in his hometown.

③ Element of retrospective tracing Tohru Nakazaki's artistic activities, from his early to recent works

This exhibition has an element of retrospective, presenting a trajectory of Nakazaki's activities from his early works to his recent ones. From *signmaker NAKAZAKI*, his representative work, through paintings, drawings, recompositions of past installations, and three-dimensional works with acrylic colors and fluorescent lights to his new installation about Mito—featuring both new and old works, the exhibition presents a comprehensive picture of the artist Tohru Nakazaki.

④ New orders are available for his representative work *signmaker NAKAZAKI*, as the artist will conduct open production

At the gallery located at the end of the exhibition venue, during the first half of the exhibition period, production of new pieces of *signmaker NAKAZAKI* will take place, open to the public. Orders for signboards as Nakazaki's works will be collected beforehand. Then after a dialog between the client and the contractor—Nakazaki—the actual signboard will be produced. During the latter half of the exhibition period, the completed collection of signboards will be exhibited.

Criterium 99 Hiroko Enomoto

For the 99th exhibition of the series Criterium, Contemporary Art Center, Art Tower Mito is pleased to introduce the work of Hiroko Enomoto. Enomoto creates work on the themes of vulnerability and the process of repairing, found in everyday experiences such as encountering and interacting with others.

Since the beginning of her career, Enomoto has presented spatial installations composed of drawings, texts, photographs, videos, and other various media. More recently, she has also developed her interests in materials such as herbs and beeswax, which are used to heal wounds, and has incorporated them into her work and activities.

In this exhibition, Enomoto will present a body of new work that embraces vulnerabilities and memories that are overlooked while prioritizing productivity and consumption, and turns our eyes to the process of accepting that arises through the passage of time and the act of caring.

ACCESS

Train:

Take the Limited Express on the Joban Line from Ueno Station (also from Shinagawa and Tokyo Station), Tokyo, and get off at Mito Station. The Express runs every 30 min. The ride takes 65-85 min.

From Mito Station, take a bus from stop no. 4, 5, 6 or 7 at the North Exit bus terminal and get off at "Izumi-cho 1chome," the fourth stop. Walk toward the direction of the Mito station and cross the street (route #50) on the first crossing. Walk ahead in a narrow lane in parallel to the crossing. It is a 2-min. walk to Art Tower Mito. Highway Bus:

Take a highway bus bound for Mito (via Akatsuka route or Ibarakidaigaku route) from the stop No. 4 at the highway bus terminal located at the Yaesu South Gate of Tokyo station. The ride takes approx. 100 min. Get off at the "Izumi-cho 1-chome" stop. It is a 2-min. walk to ATM.

Get off at Mito IC on Joban Highway, and drive toward the city center on the route #50 for about 20 min. ATM is on the crossing of route #349.
